French

What will you study in Year 12?

Students examine issues within two main topics: Social issues and trends and Artistic Culture. They will also undertake a detailed study of a film. Students will develop their abilities to communicate in written and spoken French and deepen their understanding of the cultures of the countries where French is spoken.

What will you study in Year 13?

In the second year a literary text is studied in detail as well as deeper consideration of political and social issues in France.

How will you be assessed during the course?

Students will be tested regularly on their listening, speaking, reading and writing skills and on their knowledge of grammatical structures. There may also be opportunities to visit France and put into practice the skills acquired during the course as well as opportunities to see how French can be relevant in the workplace.

There are 3 examinations: Listening, reading and writing and translation about the themes studied; Writing about the book and the film; Speaking

Where will this course lead?

Anywhere that French is spoken! In addition, knowledge of a language is a benefit in many fields including science and engineering. Languages can be combined with a wide range of degree subjects and languages graduates are greatly sought after in the job market.
