





United Kingdom Mathematics Trust

Congratulations to all our students who sat the **UKMT Senior Maths Challenge on Tuesday 3rd** November.

The 90-minute multiple choice paper, sat online, encourages mathematical reasoning, precision of thought, and fluency in using basic mathematical techniques to solve interesting problems.

It is tackled without a calculator and with the added jeopardy of negative scoring for those whose proposed answers are incorrect.

It is aimed at Sixth Form students although 6 students in Year 11 and 1 student in Year 10 also chose to participate.

Our students performed magnificently!

Kitty C (Yr10) who scored Best in School and has qualified for the British Mathematical Olympiad 1 follow on round held on 26th November, an opportunity offered to only 1,000 of the very highest performers.

In the October half-term, I undertook one week of work experience with **Dentsu** and

Salesforce following the competition:

Dentsu are one of the biggest global marketing service groups, who have worked with the likes of Aston Villa FC, Aviva, Kellogg's, P&G, Microsoft, Burberry and many more, while Salesforce

are a customer relationship management solution who work with the likes of **Dentsu**.

Over the course of the week, I learnt valuable interview skills of which I got to put into practice on the final day, where I had a mock interview with interviewers from both companies.

It was also extremely insightful to talk to numerous people in different media roles to not only find out about their current jobs, but how their careers began and then progressed, leaving them where they are today.

Every day was a panel of people talking about such experiences and their job roles, but a couple of people I was privileged enough to talk to have had some really exciting careers in particular: one started her whole career working In the White House, while another in her teenage years watched Zoella's videos on YouTube... and now manages her.

All this, in combination with the mentoring I have been offered, has helped me decide on the next steps I am going to take to (hopefully!) have a career in the media industry post A-Levels, that **Dentsu** have very kindly said they will support!

On top of this, I feel honoured to say that I was asked to meet the Global CEO of Dentsu on Monday 16th November, following my work

experience. The meeting was a brilliant insight into the world of business in media: I was fortunate enough to listen to Raja Rajamannar, the CMO (Chief Marketing and Communications Officer) of Mastercard in conversation with Wendy Clark (Dentsu's CEO) which was followed by a 'Q and A' session with myself and the other winner on the 'Rise **Up'** challenge. I was asked about my experience with the challenge, my weeks work experience and how Dentsu can help me in my future career.



The meeting was broadcast live to over 16 different time zones with questions being asked from **Dentsu** offices all over the world. I would also like to say thank you to **Ms Casson** for her ongoing support!

SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT FUND

We are delighted with all the school improvements that have been made over the last few months, particularly during this period of disruption whilst dealing with the COVID pandemic.

THE NEW SCHOLARS CAFE



Our new Sixth Form Café that we have aptly named 'Scholars' looks absolutely fantastic.

This project cost around £100,000 and the main commitment to this cost came from school funds.

We are also about to embark on further building work involving the complete restoration of the school's flat roofs and the replacement of all the Crittall windows in the Main School, originally built in 1957. We have successfully secured some Government funding towards this project but despite this, a significant financial contribution is also being made by the school.

Further enhancements have also been made to the Year 13 Private Study Room, previously the Staff Quiet Room and plans are in place to replace the seating in the Science Department to ensure students' comfort whilst studying in those rooms for extended periods of time.

The school has also recently invested in the purchase of around **90 laptops** for use by students in school enhancing lessons taught throughout the curriculum. In addition, **laptops/iPads** have been purchased for **all staff** to assist in future-proofing ourselves in case of further lockdowns and ensuring that staff can continue to deliver excellent virtual lessons for those students who may be required to self-isolate.

We noticed that we had a very keen poet in our midst, Imogen F in 10A. Imogen's poems were a delightful surprise over the summer and several were published in the gazette.


We have decided to award Imogen the role of 'SHSG poet Laureate'. She will produce poems that reflect the key events in the life of SHSG and our wider community.
