Dear Parents, Carers and Students,

Please find below information and updates from this week.

English, Maths and Science support

We have invested in a GCSE core subjects' support programme called Tassomai and would like to signpost parents to a GCSE survival guide (for parents), which has been produced by Tassomai. The guide is a free pdf handbook for parents, full of practical advice from core-subject specialists and mental health experts.

The topics covered in the guide are being expanded on the <u>Tassomai blog</u>. This month the focus is on mental health; next month the core-subjects and what GCSE parents need to know about them will be covered.

All students in Year 11 should now be familiar with Tassomai and completing a minimum of four daily tasks per week as part of their science homework.

Parents will receive a weekly progress report via email detailing your child's progress in English, Maths and Science on Tassomai. The report can be used to identify areas where extra support may be needed and the areas of strength. Parents can book a free micro-tuition session via a link in the weekly parent report to address specific gaps in knowledge.

I hope you will find the resources from Tassomai useful.
