Cross Country Regional Final

On Saturday, our Junior Girls (Years 7/8) and Intermediate Girls (Years 9/10) competed at the Cross-Country Regional Final. Due to the course being flat, it was a very fast race. The Junior Girls won and are now the Essex and Suffolk Regional Champions! Shiloh O in Year 8 was placed overall 1st and is now the overall Regional Champion for Junior Girls. The Inter Girls also performed exceptionally well placing 3rd. This means that both teams have qualified for the National Final in Newquay on Saturday 4th December. Good luck girls in green!

A Level Drama Performances

During the past two weeks, GCSE and A level Drama students have presented the first of their exam performances as actors, or as costume/set designers. The GCSE students devised original work from a given stimulus and the A level students took the classic texts, *Dr Faustus* by Christopher Marlowe and *Waiting for Godot* by Samuel Beckett, and re-imagined these for a contemporary audience. They also had to show the influence of theatre practitioners in their work using *Antonin Artaud*, and *Punch Drunk* respectively. Finally, all of the students had to submit portfolios of the process of creating their performances or designs. Well done to all the students involved.

Southend Music Festival

On Tuesday of this week, our largest two ensembles, SHSG Orchestra and SHSG Wind Band, performed at the Southend Music Festival - their first live performance since December 2019! They were awarded 'honours' marks of 86 and 88 and brought the trophies, which we have held since 2017 and 2012, back to SHSG for another year. We are particularly proud of the adjudicator's comments on the Wind Band's '*well-balanced sound..., tight rhythms, and well-pointed accents and syncopation*' and the Orchestra's '*excellent balance between delicate playing and fuller forte sections*'.

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Well done and thank you to all students involved - it is your hard work and dedication that makes the SHSG Music Department so successful; thanks should also be extended to your parents for supporting your music-making year after year. Novem Consort will compete at the festival later on Friday evening, and all ensembles will be performing in the upcoming Christmas Concerts on Tuesday 7th and Wednesday 8th December - tickets are now available from the school bank.

Sixth Form Varsity Match

On Wednesday afternoon, we hosted the first ever Key Stage 5 'Varsity Match' against SHSB. It was fantastic to see so many students participating and supporting. Congratulations to SHSB who were victorious in both football and netball, so we look forward to repeating the fixture in the new year. The Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation issues advice on second dose of COVID-19 vaccination for 16 to 17 year olds

The Joint Committee on Vaccination and Immunisation (JCVI) has advised that all healthy 16 to 17 year olds should be offered a second dose of the Pfizer vaccine, for information click [here](#). The decision is based on a review of the latest evidence and has been accepted by the Government. The second vaccine dose should be given 12 weeks or more following the first vaccine dose. For those in this age group who have had the COVID-19 infection, the second vaccine dose should be given 12 weeks or more following the first vaccine dose, or 12 weeks following a positive COVID-19 test result – whichever is later. Those 'at risk' will continue to be offered a second dose 8 weeks after their first dose. 16 and 17 year olds will not be vaccinated through the schools programme, but through vaccination centres, community pharmacies and GP led primary care network sites. The national booking service will be available from Monday 22 November for 16 and 17 year olds to book their vaccine.

World HIV/AIDS day on 1st December 2021

In the week building up to World HIV/AIDS day, students will be having an age-appropriate assembly during morning form time. Year 11 will not have assembly due to PPEs taking place. Ms Spilstead will be operating an honesty box system based in the Geography office in B Block where students will be able to pay the £1 donation and take a red ribbon (or pay via ParentPay and take a ribbon). This will start from *Thursday 25th November*. We thank you for your support in advance, as we normally raise a significant sum of money to support further research, campaigning and support for those affected by HIV/AIDS.

Christmas Dinner on Thursday 16th December 2021

Students are required to pay in advance if they would like Christmas dinner *by Monday 6th December*. Tickets are limited and will be issued by the School Bank on receipt of payment. Our preferred method of payment is ParentPay, and you will need to choose a traditional or a vegetarian meal by entering this information in the Mandatory Notes Box before purchasing your ticket. This is a separate option on ParentPay and cannot be debited from your dinner money account. **Please note that the canteen will not be providing any other food on that day.**


Messages from the Head Student Team
