Sixth Form Open Evening

On Wednesday, 3rd November we were delighted to welcome approximately seven hundred and fifty visitors to SHSG's Sixth Form Open Evening. I would like to take this opportunity to thank all the staff and the students involved. It was a long evening but was extremely rewarding being able to share our enthusiasm, passion and ambition for SHSG to so many visitors.

The feedback we received was excellent and, as always, visitors were full of praise for our students, who are the school's greatest ambassadors.

Year 11 Exam Preparation

Year 11 took part in three interactive workshops delivered by coaches from *InnerDrive* on performance under pressure, mastery mindset, and habits of success today. *InnerDrive* is a mindset coaching company working in education, business and sport. They specialise in realising the potential behind Growth Mindset, Metacognition and stress management strategies.

Today, Year 11 learnt techniques on how to deal with negative thoughts and the importance of taking responsibility to improve their motivation, learning, confidence and performance.

The Inner Drive event is the first stage in a larger programme of activities focussed on year 11. The year will be a combination of care and challenge. The first challenge will come in the form of the PPEs. These opportunities will be launched with

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students after the PPEs. Also, with the Year 11 parents' evening in January you will be able to meet with teachers to discuss these post PPE plans.

From what I hear so far year 11 are rising admirably to the forthcoming challenges and I look forward to sharing their successes and their learnings in the coming weeks.

Message from Director of Public Health - COVID-19 FAQs

If my child has missed getting their vaccination in school, where can they get it done?

From Friday 5th November, the online booking system will open for 12-15 year olds to have their Covid-19 vaccination at the Southend Civic Centre vaccination site. Please check the NHS website nearer the time to book an appointment.

Who can I call if I have questions or concerns about my child's vaccination?

You can call EPUT (Essex Partnership University NHS Foundation Trust) who are delivering the school vaccination programme: 0300 790 0597

Why should I regularly test my child?

Covid-19 remains with us and 1 in 3 people do not show the usual symptoms of: temperature, cough and loss of taste or smell. We want children to be able to continue attending school safely and the best way for them to do that is regular, twice weekly testing with lateral flow device tests (LFDs).

How do I get test kits for my children?

If your school, workplace or local pharmacy cannot give you home LFD kits, you can order them from the <u>gov.uk</u> <u>website</u> to be delivered directly to your home. Other advice and support services are in place, and you can find out more by visiting the <u>Council's website</u>.

What other measures can I take to keep my children safe?

- if your child is a close contact, make sure they take a PCR test
- wash your hands regularly
- · ventilate indoor areas
- and wear a face covering in crowded places
