Twice-weekly asymptomatic testing

The last date that asymptomatic test kits were provided to the students was Monday 21st February to cover the period up to the week commencing 14th March 2022.

Since 21st February the Government removed the guidance for staff and students in education settings to undertake twice-weekly asymptomatic testing.

We are therefore no longer receiving deliveries of test kits and hence students will no longer be prompted by email to undertake these regular tests. We do request, however, that if students do test positive, they continue to report this result on the school's TestRegister system. Access to this system will be via a link on the school's website under the student tab here or under the Parents' tab here.

The government education testing delivery channels will remain open so that staff and students of secondary age and above can access tests if needed to respond to local public health advice, in relation to outbreaks. Staff and students are also able to access test kits from their local pharmacy.

We are also advising parents to follow the government guidance which states that adults and children who test positive continue to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least 5 full days, and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received 2 negative test results on consecutive days.
