#### **Prince Charming**

On Friday 18<sup>th</sup> March we welcomed members from *Break the Cycle* to give an interactive scenario-based assembly to Year 8. The session was called *'Prince Charming'* and was focused on how to spot signs of unhealthy relationships by following a group of characters navigate new relationships in the modern day. <u>Break the Cycle</u> supports anyone aged 13-19 in the Southend Borough that thinks they could be experiencing an unhealthy relationship and can be reached through their Instagram and Twitter platforms.

## Mobile Phone Use

As we approach the last two weeks of term and will have had two terms' implementation of our mobile phone policy, I would like to give parents, staff and students an opportunity to review the policy and help us decide on any potential next steps. 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We found during the Pandemic that online resources and the introduction of platforms such as SMHW and MS Teams were very beneficial for students and staff, and that parents had quick and easy access to information such as homework. This year, after consultation and a considerable amount of research, we made the decision to allow students to continue using their phones to be able to access and use the new platforms in school, especially as they can access information about their timetables, homework, rewards and so on.

There are many advantages to having access to phones to support learning and an eminently sensible argument that young people should be taught how to use phones sensibly and appropriately rather than simply banning them. However, there is also a strong argument that young people should be encouraged to reduce screen time, spend more time talking to each other, and not to allow phones in school.

## Online Safety Webinar for SHSG Parents - Thursday 31st March starting at 8.00pm.

We are pleased to offer the opportunity for parents of SHSG students to attend an online safety webinar on Thursday 31<sup>st</sup> March from 8.00pm-9.30pm. The webinar will be delivered by 'The 2 Johns', retired police detectives who now deliver bespoke child exploitation training to professionals, parents and children. You may have seen either one of 'The 2 Johns' present at numerous key events in relation to the Online Child Sexual Exploitation of Children (OCSE). They have given interviews for BBC Breakfast TV, BBC Radio 4, Channel 4 TV and numerous other local radio stations and have presented in schools across the UK. The session will cover:

- the most up to date risks of using the internet and social media apps
- tips and suggestions on how to reduce these risks to keep your children safe online
- signposting to further resources and information
- advice on how to get help your child if things go wrong

'The 2 Johns' will be at SHSG in person all day on Thursday 31<sup>st</sup> March. Students and staff will be taking part in online safety workshops in school throughout the day, followed by the virtual parent event in the evening.

We believe it is essential to work together with parents to help keep our students safe online. We strongly recommend that you attend the safeguarding webinar. See what other parents across the UK are saying who have attended the webinar with 'The 2 Johns' here.

#### SHSG Rugby

Year 12 student, Isabelle, is one of our Physical Education Captains and won a Jack Petchey award in February 2022. She was nominated by Mrs Buscombe as she has done such a brilliant job of promoting rugby in school and gives up a lot of her own time to run the sessions, as well as encouraging SHSG students to get involved with external clubs. The money that she has been awarded will now be used to invest some more equipment so we can prepare for some competitive fixtures next season. We asked Izzy to share with parents about what she has achieved in school and her links on the Saracens 'Empower Her' project:

'As a school captain and passionate sportswoman, I decided to run the school rugby club. Rugby is an inclusive club for students in years 7-10. I have been running the club this year for both Tag rugby and rugby Union. As a coach my main goal is to increase participation in girl's rugby and create opportunities for students to develop a love and enjoyment for rugby and sport in general. At the start of this academic year there were 3-5 students attending rugby club, but through different techniques I now have a club of 20 enthusiastic girls and hope for this to continue to grow. I have been involved in the 'Empower Her' project with Saracens RFU; this project aims to give girls like myself the tools to empower the younger generations to break down stereotypes and boundaries to increase participation in rugby. My mentor in this project is Katie Barnes (Saracens first team player). She has supported me to achieve my goals of inspiring many new people to try rugby and become a role model to the younger years. Through going into year 9 PE lessons and leading the sessions in rugby, I was able to build up the number of people coming to the club at lunchtime and spark and interest for some of them to join clubs outside of school. The girls fully engaged in the PE lessons and it was great to see them enjoying a sport and want to learn more about it. ### Year 12 Preparation for Law – Aliyah K

This week, Year 12 students enjoyed their second Law Workshop with Jeremy, a practising barrister and Rob a practising solicitor. The sessions have been informative and inspirational. We thought that parents would be interested to read Aliyah's feedback:

As an aspiring barrister, I had the pleasure of attending this session. Jeremy and Rob presented the differences between the roles of a solicitor and a barrister. Jeremy explained that being a barrister entails advocating for clients who may be facing one of the most difficult days of their lives in court. Solicitors act as advisors and researchers for their clients. I find it fascinating that each lawyer in the United Kingdom is a member of a chamber, and that in order to join a chamber, you must first complete a pupillage. Jeremy will offer workshops for year 12 students every half-term to assist them in achieving their ambitions of pursuing post 18 pathways in Law. The abilities needed to be a lawyer, such as advocacy and public speaking, as well as how to make a convincing case against an opponent, will be covered in these sessions. My peers and I would want to express our gratitude to Jeremy and Rob for taking the time to meet with us in order to assist us in achieving our goals.
