## National Theatre 2022 Winning Play

We are delighted to announce that Eloise in Year 12 has won *New Views 2022* with her play, *Barrier(s)* from over 400 entries. It will be performed at the National Theatre, directed by Lucy Jane Atkinson, featuring a cast of professional actors from the D/deaf community, and performed in a mix of BSL and spoken English. Eloise will be involved in bringing the play to the stage, joining the cast and crew when they begin rehearsals on 20<sup>th</sup> June.

Eloise is the most extraordinary young woman who champions the cause of her deaf community at every opportunity. She has taken part in our lunch time New Views playwriting programme for three years and her NT mentor, playwright Jennifer Farmer, cannot speak too highly of her. The play will be shown on 6<sup>th</sup> July at 7.30pm and 7<sup>th</sup> July at 2pm and 7.30pm at the Dorfman Theatre. Alice King-Farlow, director of Learning at the National Theatre said:

## **Bringing Sociology to Life**

On Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> June, Year 12 Sociology A Level students joined Sixth Form students from King Edmunds school to take part in a live MS Teams discussion with eminent sociologist Professor Louise Archer from the Institute of Education at UCL. This was a great opportunity to bring our curriculum to life, and students benefitted from being able to ask Professor Archer questions linked to their studies.

Students enjoyed hearing about Professor Archer's route to becoming an educational researcher. Professor Archer talked about some of the research she has worked on, such as the 'Nike Identities' study, investigating why students from some social groups may be less likely to go to university, and what can be done to improve their life chances.

Sociology Captain Deborah remarked: "In sociology we study the work of many different theorists, so it was very beneficial to have an opportunity to talk with somebody that has an impact on aspects of our course. It was great to ask Professor Archer about her research and understand her thought processes and reasonings. Talking to her first hand makes all the difference. It was an amazing session"

The sociology department has more sessions planned with leading sociologists such as Professor Diane Reay from Cambridge University, and Professor Venkatesh, author of *Gang Leader for the Day*, who will be speaking to us from Columbia University, USA.
