Please find below information and updates from this week.

The SHSG 109th School Birthday

We celebrated the 109th school birthday today and welcomed guests, including ex-headteachers of SHSG and some students from 1951! It was a fantastic day; I think that everyone will be exhausted from the range of activities.

Form tutor activities included an online 'Rogue Agent' Escape room; Year 11 engaged in a colour run (information and photos later in this letter); Year 13 performed a superb pantomime to all year groups; and the assembly, attended by our VIP guests, involved musical and poetry performances, and the singing of *Jerusalem* and *Happy Birthday*! In the birthday assembly, I spoke about the early days of the school and the move in 1913 to Boston Avenue.

The rainbow represents the SHSG house colours, and the owl is an iconic part of the school outside my office. Even the school therapy dog, Florence, makes an appearance. I am sure you will agree this is a wonderful design!

Year 9 Battlefields Trip

Last week, 120 Year 9 students joined the History Department, Mrs Sanz and Mrs Bernier on a trip to Suffolk to visit First World War Huts and Trench reconstructions. They all had a brilliant time exploring the most realistic First World War trench reconstruction in the UK, handling decommissioned munitions, trying on uniforms, and learning military marching drills. They also gained a wealth of knowledge from the living history educators in authentic Great War kit, who really brought the trenches to life. The Zeitgeist team couldn't praise our students highly enough; everyone said what a pleasure it was to work with them, and that the day went far too quickly! BBC 100 Live Event

We were delighted to welcome the BBC into school on Thursday. As part of the celebrations of the BBC reaching 100, they are visiting schools around the country to share stories. As we have been running a BBC Young Reporters club for many years, we were selected to be part of the project and Young Reporters in Year 7 and Years 8-13 were invited to participate. The sessions were presented by BBC introducing and Asian network presenter, Jasmine Takhar, who led the discussion with BBC Essex journalist Jacob Ottoway and BBC sounds producer Rebecca Grisedale. They shared their stories of how they have overcome

difficulties to have fantastic careers with the BBC. They advised students that the best way to get on in life is to be 'authentically yourself' and aspire to be the best version of oneself. Rebecca and Jacob kindly took questions and gave careers advice to our aspiring journalists. At lunchtime the BBC Young Reporter club members interviewed the whole crew including the inspirational all female production team. Our students enjoyed the day and asked insightful, intelligent questions that impressed the producer.

Mobile Phones

We have allowed phone use throughout the two years of the pandemic and last year to support students as we moved to Microsoft Teams, SMHW, and other online learning platforms.

It has been useful to see and test out a policy where phones are allowed. We did a lot of research around schools that allow mobile phones, and we surveyed students, staff, and parents about this policy.

It is evident that in lessons and under teacher supervision phones can be a useful learning and revision tool. For example, they allow easy access to resources on MS Teams, and students can check their homework and timetable. However, we are also conscious of the amount of time that young people spend on their phones. I am sure that this will echo parents' views. Therefore, I have made the decision that students may continue to use their phones when they ask a member of staff in a lesson, but that they will not be able to use them outside of lessons. In social time, we want our young people to be encouraged to talk to each other and to spend time away from screens. In fact, we are continuing our Oracy drive this year, encouraging students' participation and confidence in speaking and presenting in public.

Students will be given clear guidance about mobile phone usage on return to school and we have updated the relevant policies. The following points should give some clarity on basic expectations.

- 1. Phones must be switched off and out of sight while on school grounds.
- 2. During lessons, with the permission of the teacher, students will still be able to use their phone to support any learning activities.
- 3. If a student is using their phone outside of lessons and teacher permission (from 8am), the phone will be confiscated and handed to reception.
- 4. Anyone needing to leave a lesson to go to the toilet must put their phone on the teacher's desk.
- 5. Year 10 and Year 11 who use classrooms for independent study at lunchtime <u>cannot</u> use their phones at those times.
- 6. Sixth form students will be given information on return to school about using phones during study sessions.

There are strong arguments both for allowing and for banning phones in school. However, we feel that this approach gets the balance right between using phones productively and in supervised conditions and focusing on issues around physical and mental health to give students some respite from looking at screens.
