Please find below information and updates from this week.

### **Christmas Carol Touring Production**

On Wednesday afternoon, Quantum Theatre Company visited SHSG to perform their version of Charles Dickens' 'A Christmas Carol'. Year 10 watched during Periods 4 and 5 and then the actors repeated their performance after school for some of our Year 9 and 11 students. Everyone studies the novella as part of their English Literature GCSE and it was a fantastic opportunity to see the text brought to life on stage. The cast of only 3 members did a brilliant job of taking us back to Dickens' Victorian England and the condensed version, which stuck closely with the original text, brought the key ideas and themes to the fore. The performance was both highly entertaining and useful in consolidating the students' knowledge and understanding of the play. The English Department are looking forward to seeing how this opportunity impacts the students' essay writing skills in the future!

### **Year 11 Higher Project Qualification students**

This week, Year 11 HPQ students have been presenting their reports to staff and students. The HPQ, Higher Project Qualification, is a student led process qualification. Students must design a research question, plan their research and develop an evaluative report themselves. Whilst they receive support from teachers who act as supervisors, students are not directed and must be self-motivated, organised and disciplined in monitoring and assessing their progress and in choosing, adapting and applying the methods that they are introduced to in class. This year's HPQ topics have included: 'measuring and assessing the intelligence of birds'; 'the impact of Brexit on the NHS'; 'whether TV and film no longer promote 'Black Love', and 'the potential of magnetic levitation trains to revolutionise the British railway industry.' All those who have presented should feel proud of their commitment and hard work to get to this point. We look forward now to reading the completed projects.

### **Year 11 Subject Fair**

Year 11s enjoyed a very well organised and presented subject fair, run, and led by Sixth Form Captains. The event was held in the Assembly Hall where Captains from our full range of A Level courses presented information about their subjects. Year 11s were able to ask questions and see examples of high-quality work. The feedback from Year 11 was very positive.

Next half term, Year 11 students will take part in their second A Level taster day on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> January 2023. Students will be attending A Level pitched lessons in 5 subjects and use this to help them decide which A Level subjects they want to study next year. Towards the end of January 2023, Year 11 students will use all the information they have gathered from the A Level taster days, subject presentations, subject fair and Open Evening to select the subjects they want to study at A Level.

### **Oxbridge Interviews**

We are delighted that so many Year 13 students have been invited to interview at Oxford and Cambridge this year. We wish all 16 students the best of luck with interviews, which begin on Monday. Students have enjoyed and benefited from specialised, external support from sessions with Oxbridge graduates and experts in fields such as medicine, law and classics to name just a few.



### **Head Student**

This week, our new Head Student Team have taken part in a series of interview tasks to secure the prestigious role of Head Student. The interview process closely follows the types of interviews and tasks that students may have in their futures, including panel interviews and a presentation to a large audience. The applicants gave presentations to students in Years 7, 8 and 10 about a leader that inspired them. Leaders that students chose to speak about ranged from Nelson Mandela, Emma Watson, and Beyonce! All eight applicants were exceptional in all aspects of the process. We are pleased to announce the Head Student of SHSG for 2022/23 is Carissa B. ### **Computer Science Bebras Competition Successes**

Recently, all students in Key Stage 3 and Year 10 computer science GCSE took part in the annual national Bebras computational thinking competition. I am pleased to report that 97 students have been given a gold certificate meaning they are within the top 10% nationally and invited to participate in the next stage of the competition (OUCC) which Oxford University are running in January 2023.

### **Christmas Non-Uniform Day Friday 9<sup>th</sup> December**

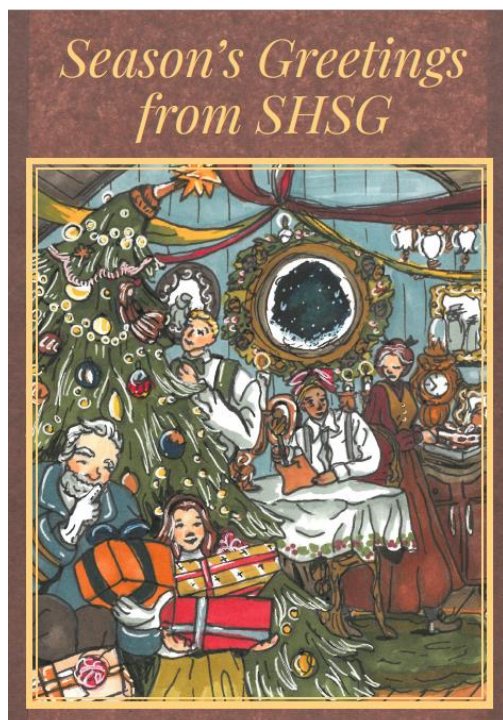

### **Attendance and Punctuality**

The vast majority of our students have an excellent attendance record. It is well known that attendance has a significant impact on student progress and the school expects all pupils to attend every day and arrive on time. As we approach the Christmas holidays, I encourage parents/carers to ensure that your child continues to attend school regularly throughout the remaining weeks of term. Please note that requests for leave of absence during term time will not be authorised unless there are exceptional circumstances.

The DfE categorises attendance below 90% as persistently absent. To ensure the highest levels of attendance for our school community, when a pupil is in danger of becoming persistently absent, parent/carers will receive a letter informing them of their child's current level of attendance. Targets are then set during a 6-week monitoring period. Should there not be a significant improvement during that time, parent/carers are invited to the school for a supportive meeting, often involving the Local Authority's Attendance Officer, to discuss how we can work together to improve the student's attendance.

We understand that from time to time that students will fall ill; however, please remember that your child should only be kept at home if it is necessary. If you are concerned about your child's level of attendance, please get in touch with their Pastoral Support Officer.

As Headteacher of SHSG, it is my job to ensure that staff, as well as students, are safe, happy, and successful. Therefore, I kindly ask parents when contacting the school either via email or telephone to consider the nature and tone of the communication. At SHSG we are fortunate to have teachers who are experts in their subjects, are experienced practitioners, and are deeply committed to the school; this is also the case for support staff.

Our behaviour and rewards system is clear and was completed in consultation with students. Behaviour points are not up for negotiation. Some teachers are receiving lengthy emails arguing to have a behaviour point rescinded. Please be advised that we will not rescind behaviour points or detentions, nor respond to emails asking us to do this.

Furthermore, some staff have received phone calls from parents where the tone and language used has not been conducive to building the strong and purposeful home-school partnership and family ethos, of which we are so proud. Not all schools provide parents with the opportunity to email or phone staff directly. We value this relationship, but ask that communication is always respectful, solution focused and succinct. Thank you.

A reminder that the **last day of term is Friday 16<sup>th</sup> December and school will finish at 12:25pm**. We are waiting to hear back from the bus companies as to which buses will be able to collect at an earlier time and will communicate this with you next week.
