Year 11 A Level Taster Day

On Wednesday, Year 11s had a fantastic day engaged in A Level taster lessons. The feedback from students was very positive. Thank you to all the staff involved. Year 12 Consent and Healthy Relationships Workshops

Year 12 welcomed back Natalie Rees, an expert speaker, in this week for an interactive workshop on the theme of Sexual Ethics and consent, as part of the Relationship and Sex Education programme for Sixth Form. The year group explored what it means to act ethically in relationships, beyond the legal basis of consent. Thank you to the year group for engaging so well and sharing interesting ideas in the session.

Careers news from Ms Casson

Students in Years 9 and 13 attended an online presentation by top HR specialist, Mr David Andrews this week during Monday's morning registration. David explained the typical professional assessment processes that students can expect when applying for apprenticeships, degree apprenticeships and graduate jobs. David covered differences between a CV and a covering letter, how behavioural assessments work, on demand videos and live online assessments. Particularly interesting was David's explanation on why employers go through this rigorous approach. It needs to be fair and transparent; they need to be able to compare candidates and ask everyone the same questions. It is a buoyant job market and it is important that you get the right fit.

Top tips –

- Be concise: a CV should be no longer than two pages.
- Enthusiasm and passion should appear in the covering letter.
- Be honest in the behavioural assessments as they are designed to ensure you will fit into the company and with their ethos/working practices.
- Apply for what you are passionate about, do your research and if you find yourself really interested after two hours of research it is probably the place for you!

Creative and Performing Arts – Year 5 Launchpad

The Creative and Performing Arts Launchpad event was a great success! Our Year 5 visitors got to experience multiple subject areas including art, drama, technology, and music within the theme of 'Express Yourself'. In Art, students were shown the paintings of Van Gogh and were encouraged to think about how colour and feelings are related. They used swirls and energetic strokes of colour to create a Van Gogh inspired sky over a Southend -on-Sea landscape. They liked looking at the work of current students and enjoyed the company of Year 10 and 12 students who came in to help.

In Drama, students began by watching a short extract from the National Theatre's production of *Treasure Island* where a treasure map is discovered. Our young visitors then created *Treasure Island* stage sets using objects from the studio. Finally, using treasure map props and riddles they had written themselves, they enacted finding the treasure. The task involved the students using space, movement, voice, and character.

Students in Product Design spent their session in the workshop designing, manufacturing and decorating working clocks to take home. The colours, shapes, styles, and themes of the clock were individual choice, and we were really impressed with the quality of the designs produced. Some of our students experienced a Food Technology lesson and were invited to choose as many toppings as they wanted from a selection of fruit and vegetables. They used their knife skills to prepare the toppings and then assembled their pizzas. Using the oven to cook their slices was the final task before most of them ate their way through their work!

In Music, students learned *Under the Sea*, from *The Little Mermaid*. They chose from xylophone and ukulele, and with the support of prefects and our music captain we put the song together in under 40 minutes, complete with calypso rhythms and singing. The Year 5 students impressed us with their perseverance and musical memory skills. Well done to all who participated: you performed swimmingly!

Media studies conference

Year 12 Media students met actor and director Simon Bird (*The Inbetweeners, Days of Bagnold Summer*, and *Friday Night Dinner*) at the Media Studies student conference at the BFI on Friday.
