Charity Week 2023

Our twelve House Captains have done us proud this week organising a bonanza of break and lunch events for our annual charity week. Careers updates

As part of our programme of careers registration talks, we were pleased to welcome speakers from South East Essex College on Monday who spoke to us about Apprenticeships and T levels. Hannah and Simon explained about the flexibility of courses they offer from 16+, from one to four years in duration. Hannah expressed the advantage of gaining hands-on experience and being paid whilst learning. A useful piece of advice was to look at LinkedIn as a first step to gaining a placement as apprentices need to find their own placement and the college will then complete the paperwork.

Simon explained that T levels are the equivalent of 3 A levels that can be used as UCAS points. SEEC offer T levels in construction, engineering, mechanics, health and science, childcare, business with lots more on the way; around 24 different levels will be available eventually. T levels have been developed by industries to plug gaps that they have found and as such offer very up-to-date skills in the form of 9 weeks of work experience in the first year alone. Assessment is slightly different to traditional exams as they are focused on testing the core skills that have to be learnt and are assessed via 6 tasks over 4 weeks often in as presentations. This proved to be a useful and informative talk that enabled students to consider alternatives to traditional A level courses.

National Careers Week

This week we have also had a spotlight on careers to celebrate National Careers Week. Students have had a chance to learn about teachers' varied career paths with a Careers Treasure Hunt. They have had assemblies on how to seek out opportunities to support them in career success. On Friday, our local MP Sir James Duddridge came to speak to Year 10 about his route into politics. During the week, departments have been making links with their subjects and careers opportunities. Thank you to all who have got involved!

International Women's Day in Sociology

To celebrate International Women's Day on 8th March, sociology A Level students attended an online lecture from Dr Pereira, an associate Gender Studies professor at Warwick University. She spoke about her ethnographic study of gender in education. Dr Pereira spent three months carrying out observations in a secondary school in Lisbon. She identified that girls and boys feel an expectation to 'perform' stereotypical characteristics associated with masculinity and femininity and discussed the impact this can have on them. Dr Pereira's enthusiasm for sociology was clear to see and very inspirational for students. The research is relevant to the Education and Research Methods topics in the Sociology A level syllabus, as well as being very informative for those considering a career in research. Dr Pereira really helped to bring the subject to life and help students to understand the work of sociologists in society.
