University Encompass Programme

Four Year 12 geographers have successfully applied for places on the St John York University Encompass Programme. This fully funded programme involves spending a week as a university student studying geography and is specifically to encourage ethnic minority students into geography and related careers. Year 8 geography globalisation trip

On Tuesday morning, Athene, Artemis and Aphrodite in Year 8 thoroughly enjoyed their morning exploring the extent of globalisation in Southend High Street. The students performed well in carrying out new fieldwork techniques such as a land use survey and environmental quality survey. Students were meticulous in gathering their data to get lots of accurate information for their learning and end of year exams. We were very lucky with the weather and managed to spend the morning in glorious sunshine, ending the trip along the seafront with scenic views.

KS3 end of year examinations 5th June - 9th June

With the KS3 end of year examinations fast approaching we wanted to draw your attention to some key information which will help you support your child during this process. The vast majority of the examinations will take place between Monday 5th June and Friday 09th June. Due to the need of specialist resources, French, German and Spanish listening assessments will take place next week during lesson time and Computer Science and Art examinations will take place the week after the examination window during lesson time.

In order to provide students with the opportunity to experience sitting an examination in more formal conditions which are more akin to those expected in public examinations all year groups will be sitting a maths examination on the 26th June in the Sports Hall after the formal public examination season has ended.

Students have been provided with a hard copy of the revision strategies guide already and have been accessing tips on effective revision through the tutor programme and assemblies led by Year 12.

Examination season can prove to be a stressful time for many students. It is, therefore important that your child plans out their revision time carefully so as to ensure that there is a balanced approach which includes some 'down time' for them. Tutors will be going through how to draw up an effective revision timetable with students in form time and outlining the importance of routines, eating well, sleeping and taking exercise to ensure they are looking after their well-being during this time.

Careers talk from Danielle Zamora (ex-student)

It is always good to hear from ex-students and learn about their successes. We were delighted to hear from ex Head Girl, Danielle Zamora in our May careers session. Danielle left in 2020 and now works in strategic management and finance at Morgan Stanley. Danielle deferred a place to study Law at Durham in favour of pursuing an 18-month apprenticeship with Morgan Stanley in their front office. After completing the scheme Danielle was promoted to a full-time analyst and has now become a manager. Her firm are funding further study at Cambridge University which will allow her to fast track to an MBA with no debt.

Danielle explained the different kinds of roles available in Investment banking, it is not all maths! She has had lots of opportunities to travel which is positively encouraged. There is stress but only as much as school and she pointed out there is stress in every job. There is a clear hierarchy in banking, but the progression route is very clear and if you are ambitious, you will be supported to succeed.

Danielle advised current students to take subjects you enjoy as HR look more at grades than subjects. It is very competitive for instance Morgan Stanley have 10,000 applications for 9 graduate placements.

Danielle's parting advice was to not feel too pressured about what you want to do and study subjects that you enjoy.
