# Year 8: Prince Charming PSHE Performance

On Monday morning, Year 8 attended the 'Prince Charming' workshop about healthy relationships. Through the medium of theatre, alongside professional guidance, students explored the signs of an abusive or controlling relationship, what to do if this happens to them, and where they can get help and support.

The students were able to interact with the performers using 'forum theatre' and by doing so help the main character to navigate a safer path through a potentially damaging relationship. The issue of positive relationships is revisited from different angles within the key stage 3 and key stage 4 Life Skills curriculum.

The workshop is delivered by local theatre company *2handers* and is an important component of our relationships and sex education programme for the lower school. We have run the workshop in previous years, and the feedback from students on Monday was once again overwhelmingly positive.


# SHSG Quills 2022-2023

# Year 12 guest lecture from the Freud Museum

On Thursday this week our Year 12 students had the pleasure of a guest lecture from the Freud Museum in London. The lecture was aimed at giving the students a greater insight into the theories of Sigmund Freud. The lecture provided information on Freud's life and the times, his key methods and ideas and a comparison to some of the other core psychological approaches that we study at A Level. It helped students to understand why we should still study Freud and his ideas, opening up plenty of opportunity for discussion and debate that we can bring back to lessons. This lecture was one of two delivered to us this year by the Freud Museum as students in Year 13 also had a guest lecture on Schizophrenia back in October. These lectures were able to take place thanks to Favor in Year 13 donating her Jack Petchey winnings to the department last academic year.
