Dear Parents, Carers and Students,

Please find below information and updates from this week.

#### Cherry Tree - new roots

Riana T, Grace O (Year 7), and Bethan L and Carrissa B (Year 13) from the Head Student Team joined formerheadteacher Alison Clewlow and me in planting the new cherry tree. Quite a number to plant such a small tree, but we wanted to mark the significance of the occasion, replacing the previous cherry tree that was older than the school. Ms Clewlow wrote to me before half term to say that she would like to buy SHSG a new tree; thankfully, the day we chose to plant it was sunny with clear blue skies.

In the School Birthday assembly, I referred to the Greek proverb: "A society grows great when old men plant trees in whose shade they shall never sit." There is certainly resonance here as we imagine students and staff enjoying this sapling in its full glory and bloom in many years to come, long after we have all left SHSG!

#### Year 13 Sociology in Action Conference

On Monday 13<sup>th</sup> November, eighteen A level sociology students attended the Sociology in Action Conference at the Emanual Centre in London. Renowned feminist Professor Ann Oakley spoke about her fifty-year sociology career and research. It was testament to the power, influence, and relevance of her work, that following her speech she was surrounded by hundreds of young people all wanting their photograph taken with her. Miss Midwinter was also delighted to have her 1976 copy of 'Housework' signed! At age 79, Prof Ann Oakley is still working in the field, and her research is still making a difference to gender based social policy.



Professor Jason Arday spoke about ethnicity and inequalities in the education system, and the importance of celebrating and promoting Black History in the curriculum. His work is particularly inspirational, as he has worked so hard to overcome global development delay and autism. He learnt to speak at age 11 and to read at age 18. He is the youngest ever professor to be appointed at Cambridge.

Related to our Crime and Deviance topic, Prof Simon Harding spoke about gang culture and knife crime, and Dexter Dias KC talked about Human Rights cases he has recently worked on. Overall, the day was very inspirational for students, and stretched them beyond the curriculum.

#### Newham Geography Fieldtrip

A dry bright Newham awaited Year 12. They explored three locations within the London Borough of Newham; Stratford, Canning Town and the Royal Docks. Using a systematic sampling strategy, the students experienced a variety of data collection techniques such as land use mapping, EQS and crime surveys. As the students were exploring the space and challenging their perceptions of it, they used a photo journey of cultural markers. We will be using this work back in the classroom from next week. A big thank you to Ms Spilstead and Mrs Robinson for accompanying the Year 12s on the trip.

#### School trips

This year, we are very pleased to be able to offer over sixty school trips to our students that enhance our curriculum offer, expand pupils' education, provide enriching social and cultural experiences, and promote independent learning. There are some areas of the administration for trips that are making it difficult for our staff to run them effectively however, namely meeting deadlines and picking children up on time when the trip returns to school. Prompt returns of consent forms, documentation and payments ensure the school meets the deadlines of trip providers. If we are unable to meet these deadlines, we may have to cancel the trip.

There have been occasions this year when parents have been up to an hour late collecting their child after a trip, including several occasions when they have been waiting until after 9pm. In future, if parents are late to collect their child on multiple occasions, their child will no longer be able to attend trips that require a collection.
