Royal Navy careers lecture

We were delighted to welcome Petty Officer Michael Barnes to SHSG on Monday 20th November. Michael gave one of our regular Monday morning registration talks online in October. We gave students the opportunity to sign up for a longer lunchtime talk and over twenty students expressed an interest in finding out more about careers in the Royal Navy!

Michael gave a fascinating talk where he went into more depth about the array of opportunities the Navy offers. We learned about the different levels of entry; it is possible to express an interest in Apprenticeships from the age of 15 years and 9 months for example. Michael explained that the biggest reason for candidates failing to be accepted is down to their fitness and directed students to check out the 'Get fit to apply' webpage 'here' that explains the different standards required.

Michael explained that the Navy can help with funding for degrees in medicine and engineering but that it is very competitive, and students would need to check the specifics of suitable engineering qualifications. Our students impressed Michael with the high quality of their questions such as how the Navy supports with humanitarian efforts. Michael was kind enough to talk to some individuals at the end about their ambitions.

A well spent lunchtime and of course everyone loves a free pen! We hope that Michael will return to SHSG for more careers events in 2024.

Walking Talking Mocks for Year 11

On Wednesday, 29th November and Friday, Thursday 30th November Year 11 will experience their second set of 'Walking Talking Mocks' in English and maths. Walking Talking Mocks allow students to experience examinations being modelled to them, 'live', by experienced teachers/examiners. They are designed to help students improve their examination technique such as, for example, identifying and interpreting command words correctly, identifying common misconceptions and managing time more effectively. The Walking Talking Mocks are, therefore, not assessed and there will be no data reported as a result. Thanks go to the English and Maths teachers for leading these.

Year 10 law workshop

On Tuesday, Year 10 enjoyed a law workshop with a practicing barrister, Jeremy, who spoke to them about what being a lawyer involves, and some of the different routes into a legal career. He answered their questions about the difference between a solicitor and a barrister, and about what different areas of law there are. Jeremy shared some of his own experiences and spoke to students about what they can do to maximise their own chances of gaining entry into what can be a very competitive career. Jeremy will be running follow up workshops across the rest of the year, focusing on helping students develop their skills of advocacy, and sharing some tips about how to think like a lawyer. He will also be running a similar workshop next week for Year 12, on Tuesday lunchtime, in the Meeting Room, so anyone in Year 12 who thinks a legal career might be for them is invited to come along.

Year 12 and 13 Human Rights Lecture

On Wednesday, 22nd November, over fifty A level students from the Sociology and Politics departments attended a lecture by Dr Tom MacManus, Senior Lecturer in State Crime from Queen Mary University, London. Dr MacManus spent several years carrying out an ethnographic study on the Genocide of the Rohingya Muslims in Myanmar. He explained the different stages of Genocide and discussed why the international community are slow to label state crimes as crime. This was an excellent opportunity for students thinking of following a career path in Human Rights, law or criminology. The topic links very well with areas covered in both the Sociology and Politics syllabuses, and students will be able to apply their knowledge to examination questions. Students who are interested in finding out more about this topic can read Dr MacManus' report written in collaboration with the International State Crime Initiative with has been emailed to them.
