The Spanish students enjoyed their day in school, with some of them saying they preferred the English system, they loved their practical lessons, which they do not have on their timetable in Spain, as well as the grounds and the canteen! They then went on to visit Canterbury, London and Cambridge, throughout the rest of the week with their teachers.

Priyanka a Year 10 SHSG student who took part in the exchange wrote:

The Spanish Exchange was such an unforgettable experience. We shared a dinner with over 35 of us, explored central London, visited Buckingham Palace, enjoyed shopping and so much more. The exchange allowed me to make so many new friends, immerse myself in the language, and deepen my understanding of Spanish culture! I found myself integrating language practice into everyday interactions, forging meaningful connections. All the Spanish students were extremely friendly, and It was an experience that I genuinely will remember for the rest of my life.
