# **Use of changing rooms during PPEs**

As Year 10 are taking their PPEs, students in other year groups will have no access to the changing rooms, the sports hall, and the fitness suite. On the days that students have a PE lesson or an extra-curricular club, students should attend school in their PE kit. At the start of lessons (or clubs) students should go to the gym, where they will be registered and taken to their learning area. Students will be outside in all weather and should dress accordingly. There will also be changes to the extracurricular timetable, which will be communicated through MS Teams pages to students.

Form tutors will have the PE lesson timetable and clubs' timetable and will therefore know when their students should be in PE kits. Should your child have any questions, please ask them to see a member of the PE department.

Normal changing arrangements will resume on Monday 15th April 2024.















#### **Year 9 GSCE Options**

Thank you to parents and carers of students in Year 9 for supporting their child in selecting their GSCE Options. The deadline for this is today, Friday 15<sup>th</sup> March. If you have not been able to use the SIMs platform to select your child's GCSE Options, they will be asked to do this during a registration next week.

The next stage of this process is that students will confirm their GCSE subjects and the priority order so the option blocks can be built around these choices. If there is oversubscription to subjects or subject combinations that are not possible, the priority order will be used to allocate students their reserve subject choice. Students will be notified of their subject choices by letter on Friday 26<sup>th</sup> April 2024

## A visit to Parliament

On Wednesday 6<sup>th</sup> March, Jocelyn A, who is currently the Member of Youth Parliament for Southend, was invited to Parliament to present on the topic of universal free school meals. Please read below for what Jocelyn had to say about this experience:

'On Wednesday 6th March, I was invited to Parliament by the Minister of the State of Schools and Anna Firth MYP to present a pitch on Universal Free School Meals and to vocalise my argument for reasons why the project should be taken up UK-wide. As part of the Southend City Council, I am the Member of Youth Parliament for Southend representing the thoughts of all young people in the area and the project derived from discussions in the British Youth Parliament. The objective of the campaign initially was to replicate London's Free School Meal system in Southend, and for that to happen, there would need to be increased funding. Consequently, I based my project around it. In Parliament, the experience of a life of being an MP and presenting my Free School Meals project to the Minister of the State of Schools was amazing alongside representing SHSG doing this. Being able to work with other MPs to present the information that we have spent months working on was both relieving and exciting as more Government officials were able to hear about our ideas and make an impact. Consequently, we got positive feedback and further on down the line we hope to continue spreading the importance of Universal Free School Meals and see it in action!'





# Year 12 Psychology guest lecture

On Friday 1st March 2024, the Year 12 psychology students had the opportunity to attend an online guest lecture with Prof Becky Milne from Portsmouth University. She has a wide array of experience in psychology and criminology but of particular interest to us was her experience working with the police in developing the Cognitive Interview to help make eyewitness' testimonies a more accurate form of evidence. Prof Milne has worked not only with police departments in the UK and Ireland but also around the world including Australia, New Zealand, and Singapore. She has been heavily influential in researching in this area, but also in writing policies, training the police and she has worked on several high-profile cases. The students enjoyed hearing about her first-hand experience in this field and it gave them a real insight into how important psychological research has been in aiding our understanding of human memory in the real world. Prof Milne was also able to provide some practical memory revision tips and she has passed on some related wider reading for students to engage with. We thank her very much for giving up her time and look forward hopefully to seeing her again in the future.

This 5-day event has once again been a roaring success, with the whole school community coming together and fundraising for Comic Relief, Southend HARP, Little Havens and Kids Inspire. Monday lunchtime signalled the start of what promised to be a hugely enjoyable week, as the Sponge the Teacher event kick-started the activities. We have noticed over recent weeks an increase in the number of students who are contacting home to say that they are not feeling well and require collection. I would like to remind students and parents that the correct procedure if a student feels unwell at school is for the student to alert a member of staff and report to reception. Students must not contact parents. Our pastoral team will work with the student to see if they are able to stay in school and then, if required, contact home regarding collection. Attendance at SHSG is excellent. From the start of the academic year to February half term, years 7-11 were present for 95.3% of the time; this contrasts with a national average of 91.5%.
