Year 8 trip to St Omer

This week, Mr Smith and a team of staff took Year 8 on a trip to St Omer in France. Students had the opportunity to enjoy a picnic in the park, plenty of sight-seeing and, of course, shopping! Students even had free access to a fabulous historical account of the town – courtesy of Mr Smith himself!

Use of changing rooms during PPEs

As Year 12 students are taking their PPEs from Monday 22nd April, students in other year groups will have no access to the changing rooms, the sports hall, and the fitness suite. On the days that students have a PE lesson or an extracurricular club, they should attend school in their PE kit. At the start of lessons (or clubs) students should go to the gym, where they will be registered and taken to their learning area. Students will be outside in all weather and should dress accordingly. Spring Concert

On Wednesday evening, the music department hosted its spring concert, which showcased the whole array of SHSG ensembles, featuring performances by students from every year group. Highlights included the Cuban-inspired *Danzon No.2* for orchestra, Schubert's *Ave Maria* performed by Chamber Choir, the *Schindler's List* theme was played sensitively by Highly Strung, and Guitar Ensemble's powerful rendition of The Cranberries' 1990s grunge protest song, *Zombie*, was popular. There were some stand-out solo performances too: Ayo gave a beautiful, expressive rendition of *Aria* from Suite Antique on flute, Head Prefect Francesca manifested Elbow's Guy Garvey in *One Day Like This*, and former music captain Angela reinvented James' Brown's hit *I Got You* (I Feel Good) with the Jazz Ensemble. The students have dedicated many lunchtime rehearsals to this programme, and we thank all those made this happen through their musical talent and commitment. Our next concert of the year is just two weeks away: the Evening of Song on **Friday 3rd May at 7pm**. If you've not attended this event in previous years, it is a celebration of the choral singing at SHSG, including all our choirs: Chamber Choir, SHSG Choir and Novem Consort, with Year 13 soloists too. This week, during lunchtime, students competed in the annual House Music competition in the main hall. We heard performances on piano, classical guitar, violin, drum kit and vocals. The event was hosted by our music captains who commended the high standard of performances, with particularly strong competition from Artemis, and we enjoyed the lively support from the student and staff audience in the Hera and Hermes' heat on Thursday. The final will be held this Monday 22nd April where the winner will be awarded the House Music trophy. Art Department: Trinity Champion Centre

Here at SHSG we offer the opportunity to do Arts Awards at all three levels – Bronze, Silver and Gold. We have been recognised for the quality of the creative work produced, the diversity of the projects and the fact that we enter such a large amount of successful applicants. The Art Department are now looking forward to working with Trinity who are the examination board for Arts Award as part of our new role as Trinity Champions.

Year 10 mock interview experience

Year 10 have been working hard all year developing their career skills. Under supervision from their form tutors and Lifeskills teachers, students were taught how to write CVs and they now all have a well-supported document that they can use to apply for part time jobs or independent work experience during the summer holiday.

The next stage consisted of how to research different employment area skills and requirements. They were able to watch videos that explained the different aspects required to pursue careers in diverse fields such as Law, Banking and Finance, Health and Medicine, Engineering and Media and Communication. Students were then invited to write a covering letter to apply for a job in their chosen field.

The culmination of this learning has been a 'mock interview'. We invited governors, old girls, friends, and supporters of SHSG including the aspiration charity Make Happen <u>https://www.makehappen.org</u> to come in across two days where each student was matched with a bespoke interviewer.

To make the experience as authentic as possible, students were encouraged to dress in smart clothes and were given the opportunity to practise their handshakes and other important social skills such as making eye contact beforehand. The interviewers were really impressed by the calibre of the students' performances. Feedback included:
