Remembrance Events

On Monday 11th November students commemorated Remembrance Day with an informative and thoughtprovoking assembly delivered by Ms Laird, our head of History. This was followed by a whole school service just before 11 o'clock. The service was attended in person by Years 7, 8, 12 and 13 and remotely by Years 9, 10 and 11. Ella F (Year 12) started the service by explaining the origins of Armistice Day and Afie D (Year 12) continued by outlining how the values that we are commemorating in others can be applied to our everyday lives. Sophie P (Year 12) then read The Last Post by Carol Ann Duffy. The service was concluded by Mr P Stillman playing the last post and the school paying its respects by honouring the two-minute silence. As part of the commemorations several students attended school in the uniform of their cadet force / uniformed club. Thank you also to our Head Student, Zahra-Marie, and Deputy Head Student, Chiara, who represented the school at the remembrance ceremony at the Cenotaph, which took place on Remembrance Sunday. Black History Showcase



Year 11 and 13 Non-Examination Assessments (NEA), Coursework, Artificial Intelligence (AI) and Social Media

Year 11 and 13 students have attended an assembly given by Miss Riebold to provide information given by the Joint Council for Qualifications (JCQ) about their NEA and coursework assessments. This included details to ensure students are aware of what they can and cannot do with AI and social media in the lead up to and during examination periods. Year 12 and Year 13 English Literature "Love through the Ages" Conference

This Tuesday, 45 English Literature students attended a conference in London on the topic of 'Love through the Ages'. Students heard from a series of outstanding speakers including leading Shakespeare scholar Emma Smith, and award-winning poet Owen Sheers. The English Literature teachers were as excited as the students to meet him, and our students were, as usual, fantastic ambassadors for the school, engaged and enthused thoroughout.



Year 12 and 13 Oxford University Brainwaves Survey

This Wednesday, sixth form students took part in an important national survey on student mental health, led by the University of Oxford. Our school is part of the pilot, which aims to gather large-scale data on teenage mental health to inform better understanding and treatment of mental health issues.

Kindness and Friendship workshop with Meg Canon

As part of our celebrations this week for antibullying week we were delighted to host Meg Canon, a storyteller and film maker, as part of our assembly programme to work with Years 7, 8 and 9. The themes that she explored with the students were around the importance of kindness and how sometimes it takes courage to show kindness when others around you might not be willing to do so. Also, that kindess helps the giver, in terms of its impact on their brain chemistry, just as much as it does the reciever. Finally, she explored some strategies to help with conflict resolution within friendships. Sometimes, in school, behaviours that are seen as bullying are just fallout from friendships that have reached the end of their time, or that have been tested by an unexpected event. Her advice will help students to navigate these difficult times. I have included a link to her short film that she used to end her workshop <u>'here'</u>.

Odd Socks Day

On Friday 15th November students from all year groups showed their support for antibullying by wearing odd socks to school. The odd socks are an outward sign that our differences are what makes each of us unique and are there to be celebrated. The theme of the national anti bullying campaign this year is that people should make a concious effort to choose to respect other people and, in doing so, actively counter the harm that bullying can lead to. Through our endeavours, so far, we have raised £224.60 for the anti-bullying alliance.



Bowling competition



Attendance

Attendance of students at SHSG continues to be excellent this academic year. During the first half term of this academic Year 7-11 have achieved an impressive 97% attendance rate compared to a Southend Secondary attendance rate of 94.2% (source: School Attendance team, Southend City Council). Year 7 are leading the way with an attendance percentage of 99% for this period, well done Year 7! I would like to take this opportunity to thank all parents for working with us to ensure that our students achieve the absolute best attendance possible. This shared goal is rooted in the understanding that one day of absence from school, is five lessons of learning missed and that learning in the classroom has no real substitute. If your child is starting to struggle with their attitude to school attendance, please let us know your concerns early and we can work together to support you, and your child to improve their school attendance.
