#### Mole Day 2025

In chemistry, a mole is a standard scientific unit used to measure large quantities of small things such as atoms, molecules or ions. A mole is  $6.02214076 \times 10^{23}$  - if you had a mole of donuts, it would cover the earth with a depth of five miles!
