This week, SHSG celebrated **Anti-Bullying Week 2025**, with the theme **"Power for Good."** Anti-Bullying Ambassadors Cerys, Francesca, Elodie, Gianna and Fatima led a series of inspiring assemblies reminding students that every one of us holds power and influence—and what matters is how we choose to use it.

The message was clear: by speaking up, supporting others, and showing kindness, students can use their power to make a positive difference. Activities such as Monday's **Odd Socks Day** celebrated individuality and reinforced our belief that everyone belongs here. The interactive assemblies helped students explore practical ways to stand against bullying, both online and in person. Topics for discussion included how to:

#### Year 10 Assembly with Dr Will Lawn from King's College London

On Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> November, Year 10 students will attend an assembly delivered by Dr Will Lawn, a researcher from King's College London. The session, "Cannabis and the Teenage Brain", will explore the science behind how cannabis use can affect adolescent brain development. This is part of our commitment to educating students about health and wellbeing. Dr Lawn is also conducting a short research study to evaluate the assembly – specifically, how students perceive the session and what they learn from it. This study has received full ethical approval.

**Participation in the study is entirely voluntary.** Southend High School for Girls is not involved in collecting any data or consent and will not share any personal information with King's College London. If your child wishes to take part, they will:

- Complete two short online questionnaires (5–10 minutes each) at home one before the assembly and one after.
- Receive a £5 Amazon voucher as a thank you.

If your child is interested, they should email <u>assembly.res@kcl.ac.uk</u>. King's College London will manage all consent and data collection directly with you and your child. #### SHSG Movember Climb Everest Challenge!



Alongside the traditional questionable moustaches, a team each of staff and Sixth Form students will be virtually climbing the 8849m ascent of Mount Everest using our own Tower block staircase over lunchtimes and after school next week, a total of 908 trips to the top. They are raising awareness and money for the charity Movember to help improve men's health and mental health.

Men die on average 4.5 years earlier than women, and for largely preventable reasons. A growing number of men – around 10.8M globally – are facing life with a prostate cancer diagnosis. Globally, testicular cancer is the most common cancer among young men. And across the world, one man dies by suicide every minute of every day, with males accounting for 69% of all suicides. Movember fund groundbreaking projects all over the world, engaging men where they are to understand what works best and accelerate change.

As part of Movember, I encourage everyone in the SHSG community to check in with the men in their lives using **ALEC**:

**Ask:** Notice changes and ask how he's really feeling.

**Listen:** Give him space to talk without judgement.

**Encourage Action:** Support small, positive steps and suggest he speaks to someone he trusts—or his

GP if low mood persists.

**Check In:** Follow up. A simple message or meet-up shows you're still there.

# TYPE 1 DIABETES

#### **DIABETES AWARENESS DAY 14TH NOVEMBER 2025**

#### What is Type 1 Diabetes?

It is a serious condition where your blood glucose level is too high. Insulin is made by the pancreas and it allows the glucose in our blood to enter our cells and fuel our bodies.

IT IS AN AUTOIMMUNE CONDITION WHERE THE BODY DESTROYS ITS INSULIN PRODUCING CELLS.

If you have Type 1 Diabetes you cannot make any insulin so need to have insulin injected or via a pump.

Approximately 270,000 people in England have Type 1 Diabetes.
