# Walking Talking Mocks

This week, Year 11 took part in Walking Talking Mocks (WTMs) in English literature, English language and maths. This was their second round, building on the foundations laid in Year 10 and giving them focused preparation ahead of the PPEs in January.

WTMs give students the rare chance to watch an examination being modelled in real time by experienced teachers and examiners. The aim is simple: sharpen technique. Students are shown how to interpret command words accurately, avoid common pitfalls and manage their time effectively. Because the sessions are developmental, they are not assessed and no data is generated.

Student feedback has been strong, with many noting how useful the process is. Staff leading the sessions were equally positive, highlighting the focus, attitude and quality of work shown by Year 11.

Well done to Year 11, and my thanks to the English and maths teams for delivering these high-impact sessions.



















### Year 12 Geographers explore Newham



On Friday 21<sup>st</sup> November, our Year 12 Geographers enjoyed bright weather for their first fieldwork day in Newham. They explored Old Stratford, Canning Town and the Royal Docklands, investigating how perceptions of place shift across these sharply contrasting areas. Using a range of fieldwork techniques, students examined different stages of regeneration and gained meaningful insight into Newham's diverse urban landscape. Lunch choices ranged from independent international street food to familiar global chains, adding another layer to their understanding of place. The day wrapped up at the Royal Docklands with our annual group photo: a fitting end to an engaging and productive fieldwork experience.

## Maths in Action Conference – Year 12

On Wednesday 26<sup>th</sup> November, Year 12 A Level mathematicians attended the *Maths in Action Conference* at the Emmanuel Centre in London. The event showcased how mathematics underpins real-world careers, with engaging talks from doctors, researchers and academics. The day struck a balance between high-level academic insight and the practical, everyday applications of maths.

The conference was hosted by magician Matt Pritchard, who delivered a standout session, 'The Man Who Cannot Lose'. Using probability and number parity, he demonstrated how mathematical thinking can predict, and even drive the outcomes of his tricks.

Students found the experience motivating. Elodie P described the day as "exciting because it made me realise the potential of mathematics." Brooke S added that it "not only taught me how to achieve highly in my education, but also showed me more everyday uses of maths and even some entertaining new ways of applying it."

Art visiting speaker- Elleanna Chapman



Last week, we welcomed alumna Elleanna Chapman, who returned to speak about her work as an artist and the path that brought her into socially engaged practice. Art student Mabel S (12KJA) captured the impact of the talk:

The lunchtime lecture was striking in the way Elleanna laid bare the connection between art and protest. She grounds her work in what she describes as the "political potential of art to catalyse revolution" and uses it to express her fascination with "all things kitsch, cute and kitty-tastic,". Her bedazzled, hyperfeminine aesthetic sits firmly within working-class politics and class struggle; hearing her articulate that perspective made the session both thought-provoking and memorable.

As a former SHSG student who went on to study at the Ruskin School of Art, Oxford, Elleanna offered genuine insight into the realities of pursuing an artistic career. She was candid about the practical demands: side jobs, commissions, networks, residencies and the importance of community support in sustaining creative work. Yet she consistently returned to one core belief: that art can be a tool for collective change, and that every piece has the potential to carry a call for revolution.

That combination of honesty, ambition and conviction made the talk inspiring, grounded and challenging in equal measure, leaving students motivated to rethink the purpose and power of their own art.
